Encouragement for the Family of Believers

Our Inreach Team has been using the Peter Plan for over a year. This is the system our church adopted by which we make periodic contacts to encourage members to attend public worship. While the plan calls for removing a person from membership after a year of non-attendance, we have taken a bit longer due to steps getting stretched out. The last step involves a face-to-face talk with the inactive member, but sometimes that's been hard to accomplish, and so the 44 Week Visit sometimes becomes the 47 Week Visit, for example.

Some members have special circumstances, so we've put the steps of the Peter Plan on hold. There are other member families without special circumstances for whom we've completed all the steps of the Peter Plan but they've still not attended worship. They will likely be removed from membership in the next month or two, voted on by the church council, if they don't come.

This is not excommunication. We're not declaring them to be unbelievers. Instead, we're removing them from membership because they haven't shown willingness to be active in the congregation. Such removal does have a disciplinary purpose, to remove false comfort from any who think they are right with God simply by having their name on a church membership roster. No, a person is saved by faith. That's the only way. We are saved by trusting in Jesus for the forgiveness of our sins. Jesus promised us in John 15 that he is the Vine and we are the branches and that if we remain in him, we will bear much fruit. On the other hand, James 2:26 warns: "Faith without deeds is dead."

We can't read people's hearts. Inreach Team members and I have talked to long-time inactive members who have told us at their door, "I trust in Jesus. I just haven't been going to church." It's encouraging for me to hear them say they trust in Jesus. I believe them. Still, I am concerned for them, because I haven't seen evidence of their faith, beyond these words. If they're not attending church to hear God's Word and receive the Lord's Supper, it has me concerned that they may not be hearing the Bible message at home either. If a person is not feeding their faith with God's Word, their faith in Jesus may eventually die.

My encouragement to you – please pray and pray for church members and others whom you know haven't attended for a while. It makes me so happy to see long-time inactive members return.

One more thing. Multiple times I've heard non-churchgoing people joke. "If I stepped into church, I'd be struck by lightning." I know it's a joke, but it makes me sad whenever I hear that. The truth is the opposite. God will not strike such a person with his wrath. God is greatly *pleased* when a person enter his house after a long absence. But that common joke is a reminder for you and me that people long absent from church may be fearing the "lightning strike" from you or me. In other words, they may fear our judgmental stares and insensitive comments. So let's be gracious and kind to every unfamiliar face we see in the Lord's house. Because only by God's grace do any of us stand. "It is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8-9

This past week, we held our VBS program titled True North, Trusting God in a Wild World. The children learned that when we wonder, we feel alone, we need help, or we need hope, we can trust in Jesus. The children focused on these truths every day through Bible stories, crafts, music, and games. The older kids enjoyed doing experiments while talking about the truths every day. On the last day, the children sang some of the songs they learned for their parents, and then they enjoyed ice cream treats and a bounce house. God blessed us with 79 registered children, and an average of 60-65 attended every night.

Sunday School starts on kick-off Sunday which is September 7th. It will take place every Sunday from 10:15 - 11:00 until May. This is not just for our church families.
