The LORD's Plans Prevail

Proverbs 16 is an interesting Bible chapter on the balance between human planning and God's will. Proverbs 16:3 is one of my favorite verses: "Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." But to keep us humble and content with God's superior plans for us, there is Proverbs 16:9: "In their hearts humans plan their course, but the LORD establishes their steps."

Let's thank the Trinity that he blessed our plans just as we drew them up, in letting us build the new playground and having it mostly funded. Thank you to all who helped this plan in every way!

Ezekiel is a fascinating Bible book, depicting the glory of the LORD with fantastical descriptions. Ezekiel 40-48 fascinates in an architectural way. Bible commentaries note that this detailed blueprint for the restored temple in Jerusalem was never constructed as a building, despite Ezekiel receiving these plans from the Holy Spirit in the same century that the second temple was built. It's clear from the blueprint that this plan was meant to be a future, or idealized structure. Hints as to the symbolic nature of the blueprint include the following. The lengths and widths of the building are provided, but not the heights. No description of a roof over the temple. Vast scale – the temple complex measures 5,000 ft on each side, and wouldn't fit within the confines of Jerusalem. Supernatural river – the end of Ezekiel describes a river starting as a trickle east of Jerusalem and developing into a permanent river, flowing into the Dead Sea, and making its salt water become fresh. None of these are realities in our current world. So this may be the Holy Spirit's way of pointing us to God's eternal plans for us – the new heavens and the new earth, and the holy city we'll live in, with pleasures in Christ that go beyond our current understanding.

On the subject of plans, I took part in the Holmen Business Association (HBA) bus tour of Holmen last month. Incidentally, our church was chosen as the HBA business/organization of the month, for October. You can see the banner and the flower arrangement their board kindly gave us, in our church entrance. Holmen Administrator (Village CEO) Scott Heinig led the bus tour and explained what is happening and expected, as the bus took us from sight to sight. Here are highlights:

- Waldenberger Development, northern part of Holmen will have 270 lots, all single family
- 90 more lots nearby
- A Dominos and a Midway Deli coming soon to the area north of town near the new Kwik Trip
- A \$7 million project is expected for Main Street in 2027. Much greater capacity will be added to the sewer system, to account for all the growth to the north, which hasn't yet been built in. All utilities will be replaced.
 There will be phases, parts of the street shut down at different times.
- County Road D and V will receive traffic lights
- Holmen population is projected to be 13,500 in 2030

Let's pray that God bless Holmen's plans and continue to make this community prosper. As the hymn says, "What God ordains is always good." May he continue to bless our congregation by his Word.
